Travel

Flights:

- From Belgium, there are direct flights to Dubai with Emirates
- From the Netherlands (Amsterdam Schiphol Airport), there are direct flights with KLM and with Emirates.

- For Travellers with a European passport, there are no additional formalities.

Guidelines INDEX

- During construction, closed shoes and fluorescent vests are compulsory
- Shell Scheme stands are handed over cleaned before the fair opens, afterwards the exhibitor is responsible for cleaning. Extra cleaning can be ordered via the online manual.
- The first exhibition day is always opened by a high-ranking official. At that time, security is ramped up and every stand is expected to be manned. Protocol prohibits exhibitors from shaking hands with the official.

Voorbereiding

- Register exhibitor badges via the online exhibitor platform
- Install app so exhibitors can scan visitor badges (Free lead Capture App)
- Catering at the stand can be ordered via the online manual

Catering

- There are several restaurants on and around the fairgrounds, plenty of choice.

- There is limited free wifi available on the fairgrounds, if internet is important at your stand then it is advisable to order it in advance via the

Tips to do business in the UAE

- **Networking is essential:** Building relationships and local presence are crucial to successfully doing business in this region.
- **Be patient:** Decision-making can take time. Be prepared for a slower process as decisions often require multiple layers of approval. Definitely keep in mind a timeline of 18 to 36 months to complete deal and be patient and flexible in your payment terms.
- **Face-to-face meetings:** Face-to-face meetings are highly valued. Physical presence helps build trust. Since negotiations cost time, it is recommended to apply for a UAE number that allows you to communicate easily using What's App, for instance.
- **Formal communication:** Use formal titles and addresses. A respectful tone is essential, especially in the early stages of business relationships.
- **Be culturally aware:** Understanding diverse cultures and religions is crucial for success. The local population consists of a mix of Emiratis and expats which creates a mix of market preferences.
- **Build personal relationships:** Trust and personal relationships are crucial. Take time to get to know your interlocutors before jumping into business.
- **Know the laws and regulations**: There are several Free Trade Zones, each with their own rules. If you want to establish an office, you need specific licences or approvals. Work with local authorities or legal experts to ensure that all required licences are obtained and you are always up-to-date with the latest legislation.
- **Summer holidays:** During the summer holidays, from June to August, many people in Dubai travel abroad, making it a less ideal time for business activities. It is advisable not to do business during this period.

DUBAI CREEK

The Dubai Creek runs through the centre of the city. Formerly a fishing port and trading centre for local merchants, the Creek is now mainly used as a crossing point for tourists who want to go from one side to the other.



PALM EILAND WITH THE ATLANTIS HOTEL

This artificial island in the shape of a palm tree consists of a crown with 16 branches and a trunk surrounded by an 11km breakwater. You have several restaurants, beaches and luxury hotels here. The most famous hotel on this island is the 5-star hotel Atlantis The Palm.



DUBAI MIRACLE GARDEN

A flower garden with 45 million flowers of 60 different species. There are not only flowers and plants, but also other objects to admire.

Some examples include the world's largest flower clock, cars decorated with flowers, a replica of the Burj Khalifa, etc. it is also accessible by public transport.



DUBAI MARINA

Beautiful promenade at one of the marinas. You will also find many restaurants, shopping centres and playgrounds there.
